- Representing 4-H at commissioner meetings, school board meetings and legislative committees.
- Experiencing travel outside of their county and state.
- Networking with industry representatives, potential employers, and college and university representatives.

New Mexico 4-H youth and adults serve New Mexico communities through community service programs including...

- Collecting dental care items and warm winter essentials.
- Cleaning community parks and roadside pickup.
- Providing needed items to animal shelters.
- Contributing over 4,229 pounds of food to food pantries.
- New Mexico volunteers give approximately 125,400 hours to New Mexico 4-H programming each year.
- On average, 1 adult volunteer provides 11 hours of service each month.
- Value: \$3.8 million dollars.
