

FASHION REVUE CONTEST

Eligibility

- A. See General Rules for State Conference Participation Guidelines
- B. Must be enrolled in appropriate Sewing/Sewing Project
- C. Counties may enter three participants per category

Categories – a Contestant may select **ONE CATEGORY** to participate in

- A. **Construction**
 - 1. Sewing I (all Sewing I will be one category)
 - 2. Sewing II (all Sewing II will be one category)
 - 3. Mix and Match I
 - 4. Mix and Match II
 - 5. Senior Clothing Construction I
 - Dress Up Attire
 - Casual Wear
 - Coordinates
 - Formal Wear
 - 6. Senior Clothing Construction II
 - Shirt/Blouse
 - Pants/Shorts/Skirt
 - Dress
 - Two Piece Outfit
 - Three Piece Outfit
 - 7. Clothing Self-Determined
 - 8. Serger Sewing (Fringed Skirt and Shawl or Advanced only)
- B. **Creative Touches**
 - 1. Creative Touches Outfits (all Creative Touches will be one category)
- C. **Fashion Magic**
 - 1. Fashion Magic I – Wardrobe Planning
 - 2. Fashion Magic II – Clothing Coordination
 - 3. Fashion Magic III – Fashion Consumerism & Careers
- D. Other Options (Not eligible for Nationals)
 - 1. Sew and Go
 - Quick Sack
 - Handy Duffle
 - Super Duffle
 - Jumbo Garment Bag
 - 2. Quilting (all quilts will be one category)

Procedure

- E. Garments, sewing exhibits, and Fashion Magic notebooks, labeled with the participant's name and county, are due by the close of registration on the opening day of the State Conference – Late items will not be accepted.
- F. Garments and sewing exhibits must be accompanied by a 4-H Fashion Revue Information Sheet 200.C-4 R-2026.
- G. Items must be clean and pressed and may be covered with a plastic film cover.

- Hangers and bags may not be returned.
- H. Winning County Garments may be entered even though they have been worn.
- E. Fashion Revue is a combination of an oral presentation, modeling of the garment or sewing exhibit and response to judge's questions. Contestants will have a total of 5 minutes for their oral presentation and to model on stage. Participants can determine how they use their 5 minutes. Example: oral presentation 1 ½ minutes and modeling 2 ½ minutes ($1\frac{1}{2} + 2\frac{1}{2} = 4$ minutes). Points will be deducted for using more than the allotted time. Responses to questions by the judges are not included in the 5 minute limit.
1. Participants will use the public address system for the oral presentation and music will be provided.
 2. The following information should be included in the oral presentation
 - a) Name and County
 - b) Why did you choose this outfit?
 - c) How does it fit in your wardrobe?
 - d) Where do you plan to wear it?

*Participants may include additional information about their garment, project learning experiences and future plans.
- F. Modeling, presentations and interviews will be conducted on stage and spectators may attend. Only judges will be allowed to ask questions.
- G. Contestant order will be determined by random drawing.
- H. Ties will be broken by the sewing construction score or notebook score.

***All Garments must meet current State and National Event Clothing Guidelines to be considered for awards. Failure to comply with Clothing Guidelines will result in disqualification.*
