

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Budgeting 101

*Note: Completing all activities in this lesson may require more than one class period.



Managing money can feel tricky, especially when there are bills, savings goals, and fun expenses all competing for your attention. In this lesson, participants will explore how to create a budget, track sample income and expenses, and make intentional choices to reach goals. Learning to budget now will help participants develop habits that lead to independence and financial confidence.

SET UP

Review lesson materials and determine which worksheets and handouts you will use for the lesson. Print enough pre/post assessments, worksheets, and handouts for each participant.

ACTIVITY

- 1. Have participants complete the *Pre-assessment*.
- 2. Write on the board: What does it mean to live within your budget? Have participants think-pair-share (think individually, talk to a partner, share with the whole group). Continue with these discussion prompts:
 - Q: What are some things you spend money on now?
 - Q: Have you ever run out of money for something you wanted? What happened?
 - Q: Why might adults keep a budget?
- 3. Distribute *Budget Scenario*. Review the scenario as a whole group: *Cody is 20 years old and has two part-time jobs. He must budget for rent, food, savings, transportation, personal items, and even entertainment.*

Review Cody's scenario and answer any questions.

4. Distribute *Budget Scenario Worksheet*. Allow participants time to complete the worksheet individually or with a partner. (*Optional: Use *Budget Worksheet Example* as needed to assist participants in completing the worksheet.)

OUTCOMES

Students will be able to:

- **Identify** different types of income and expenses.
- Track spending in a scenario to see where money goes each month.
- Adjust a sample budget to meet goals, including savings.
- **Plan** their own goals and budget.

- 5. Distribute *My Personal Budget Worksheet* and allow time to complete. This may be assigned as homework or completed in the following class if needed.
- 6. Distribute the *Budgeting Discussion* and allow time for students to complete the questions or discuss as a whole group.
- 7. Wrap-up by distributing and discussing *Budgeting Tips*.
- 8. *Exit Ticket* depending on time, this can be done as a class discussion, or students can complete the worksheet in class, as homework, or in the following class.
- 9. Have participants complete Post-assessment.



Taking charge of your budget means taking charge of your life. When you track what you earn, spend, and save, you develop habits that help you make smart choices, reach your goals, and feel confident about your financial future.
