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Communication

Introduction

Effective communication is more than words; it's body language, tone, and the way we express ourselves. In this lesson, participants will explore passive, aggressive, and assertive communication styles and learn how to communicate needs clearly, confidently, and respectfully in any situation.

SET UP

Review lesson materials and determine which worksheets and handouts you will use for the lesson. Print enough pre/post assessments, worksheets, and handouts for each participant.

ACTIVITY

- 1. Begin by having participants complete *Pre-assessment*.
- 2. Open discussion with: *How do we communicate without speaking?"*

Briefly explain that communication involves both <u>verbal</u> and <u>nonverbal</u> behaviors, and our communication style shapes how others perceive and respond to us.

- 3. Distribute *What Is Your Body Language Saying About You?*. Review signs of confidence vs. low confidence. Discuss the difference between confidence and arrogance.
 - Optional: Have participants complete the Quick Reflection (list or circle 3 confident behaviors to build, 3 to reduce).
- 4. Share with the group that they will be participating in a charade activity. Follow the instructions for *This Is What Feelings Look Like Charades*.
- 5. Distribute and review the *Communication Styles* and *What is your communication style color?* handouts. Have students identify the style they most often use and briefly discuss digital and cultural considerations.
- 6. Next explain the group will role play different communication styles. Follow the *Red, Yellow, Orange, or Green? Communication Styles Activity* instructions.
- 7. *Exit Ticket* depending on time, this can be done as a class discussion, or students can complete the worksheet in class, as homework, or in the following class.

8. Have participants complete *Post-assessment*.

OUTCOMES

Students will be able to:

- Demonstrate assertive communication in real-life scenarios
- Identify passive, aggressive, and assertive communication styles
- Recognize the role of body language in communication
- Explain the impact of communication style on relationships
- Apply strategies to communicate clearly and respectfully





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LESSON EXTENSION

Lesson Extension Options

- Have students observe and reflect on real-life communication interactions (in class, at home, online).
- Ask them to write a brief reflection: "How can I be more assertive in one real-world situation this week?"

WRAP UP

Strong communication builds understanding, respect, and trust. By recognizing our style and practicing assertiveness, we can express ourselves clearly without hurting others. Let's use these skills to create positive connections in school, work, and everyday life.
